#### The Spanish Flu

The Spanish Flu has been called the most deadliest outbreak in the history of America. Three waves (outbreaks) occurred. each time we thought it was under control and began life as usual. It lasted 36 months (Jan. 1918 to Dec. 1920). There were an estimated 105 million cases and between 500 thousand and 850 thousand deaths. #### **SARS CoV**

The SARS CoV outbreak spread globally. It lasted approximately six months (Feb. 2003 to July 2003) in the U.S. before we got it under control. Some of the steps taken to contain and win the SARS CoV fight included quarantine and isolation. We had to act fast and provide the needed support nationwide to save lives. The CDC reported 8,098 people were infected in 29 countries and regions resulting in 774 deaths. In America only 8 people were infected and no deaths. # Swine Flu, MERS, Ebola, Avian Flu

The Swine Flu, MERS, Ebola, and Avian Flu showed up in America one right after the next from 2009 to 2016. All of them reeked havoc around the world. The two outbreaks of the Swine Flu in America brought us 60.8 million cases and 12,469 deaths. To read how the Obama administration responded to its first pandemic read the **CDC** report. When MERS happened we did even better, there were only 2 confirmed cases in the U.S. and no deaths. Ebola hit Central Africa hard. In America we saw 18 cases and 2 deaths. We sent healthcare workers to the frontline of the Ebola crisis in Africa.
