SBA Celebrates and Supports Black-Owned Small Businesses

The contributions black business owners have made to entrepreneurship in the U.S. are indispensable. According to the most recent data from the <u>U.S. Census Bureau</u>, there are over 3 million Black-owned businesses from coast to coast, accounting for billions of dollars in annual revenue to the U.S. economy. Black owned businesses have seen their share of challenges throughout the course of the COVID-19 pandemic. In fact, in the first year of the pandemic alone, there were more new Black-owned businesses proportionate to the total population than at any time in the previous 25 years. There are many Black entrepreneurs with unlimited potential across the nation, and the SBA stands ready to help them realize, achieve, and even rebuild their business in 2022.

Water Bill Assistance Program **Benefits for MS Families** The Low-Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) has recieved \$13 million in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds. Funds can be used to help income-eligible residents maintain access to drinking water and wastewater services through the end of September 2023. The funding is issued directly to the utility company to support families who meet income requirements. The Mississippi Department of Human Services works to serve aging and low-income populations with their utility assistance throughout the year. Legislative Updates

These updates are provided to keep you informed of legislative activities in Washington, D.C.

1. Congressman Thompson cosponsored H.R. 4521, the America COMPETES Act of 2022. This legislation directs the Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) to implement a National Engineering Biology Research and Development Initiative to advance societal well-being, national security, sustainability, and economic productivity and competitiveness. Among other activities, the initiative must include sustained support for research centers, individual investigators, technologies, and training.

2. Congressman Thompson sponsored H.R. 5633, the Department of Homeland Security Inspector General Transparency Act. This bill addresses reports conducted by the Office of Inspector General (OIG) of the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). The bill requires the OIG to submit to Congress any report finalized on or after 30 days after the enactment of this bill that substantiates.

Congressman Thompson cosponsored H.R. 3755, the Women's Health Protection Act of 2021. This bill prohibits governmental restrictions on the provision of, and access to, abortion services. Specifically, governments may not limit a provider's ability to prescribe certain drugs, offer abortion services via telemedicine, or immediately provide abortion services when the provider determines a delay risks the patient's health.

Congressman Thompson cosponsored H.R. 6464, the Hear our Heroes Act of 2022. This legislation provides a presumption of service-connection for hearing-related issues in certain veterans for purposes of wartime disability compensation. Under a presumption of service-connection, specific conditions diagnosed in certain veterans are presumed to have been caused by the circumstances of their military service.

MSDH CHILD CARE LICENSURE BUREAU

A license is required if you care for six or more children who are less than thirteen years of age. This is for any amount of time of the day or night, who are not related to you (children, grandchildren, greatgrandchildren, brothers/sisters, nieces/nephews). It includes day care centers, day nurseries, and any other facilities that fall within the scope of the above description. Obtaining a license to operate a childcare facility requires a serious commitment and investment of not only money but also time. For more information, visit www. msdh.ms.gov.



INTERNAL REVENUE SERVICE ADMINISTRATION

The Internal Revenue Service reminds taxpayers to protect their personal and financial information throughout the year and to watch out for IRS impersonation and other common scams this filing season. Text message scams are sent to taxpayers' smartphones and have referenced COVID-19 and/or stimlus payments. Phone scams are another scam that is used. The IRS does not leave pre-recorded, urgent or threatening messages. For more information, click here.



USDA WATER SYSTEMS FUNDING

The USDA Rural Utilities Service, acting through USDA Rural Development, has grant funding available now to help rural water systems that have been impacted by an emergency event. Funding can be used to repair existing system damage and to prevent future issues that are imminent. An emergency may include natural events, such as drought, tornados, hurricanes, floods, and more. Applications are accepted year-round using the online system called Rural Development. You can apply at <u>www.rd.usda.gov.</u>

PASSPORT SERVICES AVAILABLE NOW

The time frame for receiving your passport is 8 to 11 weeks. Expedited processing is available for an additional \$60 with a processing time of 5 to 7 weeks. The processing time begins the day your application is received at a passport agency or center. Plan ahead and apply early. Apply at least 4-6 months before travel date. Due to limited availiability for urgent travel appointments, the agency cannot guarantee you will receive in person service. A fee is not required for an appointment. As part of its commitment to advance equity in underserved communities, FEMA proposes collecting demographic information from applicants participating in certain FEMA programs. Collecting this information will help FEMA ensure that people who apply for assistance are treated fairly and that FEMA programs comply with civil rights, nondiscrimination and equity requirements. FEMA urges stakeholders, community groups, and the public to comment on the information collection initiative. The deadline to submit comments is March 28.
